Re: Medication Reconciliation Post Discharge Process and Coding

Dear Medicare PCPs,

We are reaching out to you to inform you of our Medication Reconciliation Post Discharge (MRP) services at Inland Empire Health Plan (IEHP).

1. What is Medication Reconciliation Post Discharge?

The process of comparing a Member's new medication orders with all the medications the Member had been taking prior to changing levels of care.

2. Why is Medication Reconciliation important?

- Reduce hospital re-admissions
- Prevent medication errors
- Improve Member's quality of care

3. Who is qualified to complete the Medication Reconciliation tool?

- Registered Nurse (RN)
- Clinical Pharmacist
- Prescribing Provider

4. What will you and your team receive from IEHP?

Medication Reconciliation Letter provided to you via fax that will have the Member's active and termed medications and recommendations from the Clinical Pharmacist.

5. What is IEHP's request of you and your team?

During your Member's post discharge follow up appointment, we ask that you review the Medication Reconciliation Letter and document **CPT code 1111F** stating a Medication Reconciliation Post Discharge has been completed.

- **CPT code 1111F** should be reported only once per hospital discharge within 30 days of discharge.
