		<ul> <li>Carmela Garnica shared her support of Primary Care         Physician home visits and explained that it is a challenge         for rural communities due to a lack of healthcare         professionals and an increased need in the older population.     </li> </ul>	
		<ul> <li>LaBianca McMillan inquired about home infusion therapy for pain management and expressed that this would be something worth looking into for those who are not able to leave their home.</li> </ul>	
		<ul> <li>Gomez responded that in-home fusion therapy is part of IEHP's Provider Network and that IEHP is working on recruiting more Providers to serve Member needs.</li> </ul>	
		<ul> <li>Julia Espinoza shared her experiences with accessing in- home health care for a family member and shared that incorporating Primary Care Providers in these visits would be great.</li> </ul>	

Additionally, Espinoza shared that it would be helpful to understand what other programs would benefit IEHP Members.	
Carmela Garnica inquired if this program would include home dialysis and shared that people from Blythe must travel to Palm Desert for that service, including low-income individuals.	11. Explore the availability of in-home dialysis and the criteria for qualification in the Palo Verde region.

• Trisha Mitcham expressed that this is a fantastic idea since Needles is a rural, small town. She shared that from her experience and interactions with community members, she believes the Needles community would accept this program with open arms.	and podiatry services in the in-home pilot.
• Julia Espinoza shared that in-home blood draws would be helpful in this program as many individuals are hesitant about getting bloodwork in a lab. Additionally, Espinoza suggested administering antibiotics intravenously in the home.	
Gomez shared there is currently a pilot program for Members to do in-home blood draws.	
LaBianca McMillan inquired about incorporating speech therapy and behavioral health services into this program.

Additionally, Myer shared how IEHP Members can enroll in the Open Access Program. This presentation addressed the CAC question: How does IEHP provide sensitive services to youth in foster care?</li> <li>XIV. CAC was asked the following feedback questions:</li> <li>How can IEHP improve services for youth in foster care?</li> <li>What are your recommendations for addressing sensitive services for youth in foster care?</li> <li>Dr. Uribe asked for clarification on whether a social worker or county representative can be contacted without the consent of the child.</li> </ul>	Action Items
		<ul> <li>Member Feedback</li> <li>LaBianca McMillan inquired if transition planning is part of the program and until which age Members can access this program.</li> <li>Meyer shared that the program assists until the age of 21. Youth and former foster youth have access to Medi-Cal until age 26.</li> <li>LaBianca McMillan asked if there is continuous training on trauma informed care with providers.</li> <li>Meyer shared that for foster youth, the recommended services for behavioral health are through the county due to a higher level of care capacity.</li> </ul>	13. Jeremy Proctor shared that as a foster parent, he believes that IEHP offers great services to foster youth.	
• Dr. Uribe shared that the IEHP Provider Network has access to an annual Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (D.E.I.) training as well as monthly Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access (I.D.E.A) training. In 2025, one of the scheduled monthly I.D.E.A training topics is trauma-informed care.	
<ul> <li>Dr. Uribe asked if there are any suggestions or ideas on how IEHP can address sensitive services with foster youth to promote this information.</li> </ul>	
Julia Espinoza shared that IEHP could spread information through social workers.	
Meyer shared that IEHP attended the onboarding for DPSS workers at Riverside County to train them on the Open Access Program. IEHP is also working on getting an opportunity to work with San Bernardino County as well.	
<ul> <li>LaBianca McMillan suggested a 1:1 appointment with social workers to share updates with medical history for Open Access clients that need sensitive services.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Meyer shared that there are programs that house and assist individuals who have aged out.</li> </ul>

Dr. Uribe let him know that CAC Members can write down any ideas that come to them.</li> <li>Julia Espinoza suggested contacting schools to partner with them to see how this information can be presented.</li> <li>LaBianca McMillan shared that universities have wellness centers where IEHP can place information to reach young adults.</li> <li>Julia Espinoza shared about Health Advocates of America. She shared that they could support with navigating the healthcare system and billing.</li> <li>Dr. Uribe shared that partnerships with organizations that already work with youth and teens could be beneficial.</li> <li>Julia suggested a partnership with the Covenant House.</li> <li>Carmela Garnica shared that in Blythe, the Palo Verde Unified School District started hosting COVID-19 clinics during the pandemic. During these clinics, professionals from Riverside County came to Blythe during a specific time to provide healthcare services to their students.
